

Internship Purpose:

The purpose of this internship is to provide an opportunity for the prospective candidate to be trained, equipped, and disciplined for pastoral ministry within the context of the full orbed life of the local church. There are five potential benefits in considering this internship:

1. Receive a supportive and loving environment of a local church that assumes responsibility for the care, training, and education of the intern.
2. Receive practical understanding and training for the essential areas of pastoral ministry within the local church.
3. Develop life long relationships with a local church and its pastors that will continue to love, pray for, and be a help to you in your future ministry and life.
4. Opportunity for a local congregation to assess and then affirm an individual's gifts and calling.
5. Exposure to a pastor's daily schedule.

Accommodations:

- Duration is four months, from May 1st to August 20th.
- The salary will be 12,000.
- We will be giving the successful candidate a large number of books and commentaries to help build their library which will include all of the books that they will be reading for the internship.

Expectations:

Expectations will vary depending on the gifts of the intern. There could be more evangelistic, preaching, or pastoral care emphasis.
