## Introduction to Apologetics (Online)

**Dr. Owen Pikkert | Apol 103/123**

This course introduces students to the discipline of Christian apologetics. The first part of the course focuses on different approaches to apologetics, including classical apologetics, evidentialism, presuppositionalism, Reformed epistemology, and pragmatism. The second part of the course focuses on common objections to Christianity. These include logical objections (such as the problem of evil), scientific objections (such as arguments against miracles), and moral objections (such as the intolerance of Christianity).

## The Book of Hebrews

This course is designed to familiarize the student with the New Testament letter to the Hebrews. Although we do not know who wrote Hebrews, it is full of glorious Christian themes that richly repay diligent study. Because Hebrews abounds with allusions to the Old Testament Scriptures it helps us understand how Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets and how his salvation is something we should rejoice in. We will also explore what Hebrews has to say about how human beings can approach a holy God and live in his presence forever as members of his redeemed family.
